CONTINUING EDUCATION FUND

The Continuing Education Fund has been established to award scholarships to deserving young people who participate and win at the Heart O' Texas Fair & Rodeo.

The fund establishes \$2,000 scholarships for Grand Champions, \$1,000 scholarships for Reserve Grand Champions, \$500 scholarships for Breed/Division Champions and \$250 scholarships for Reserve Breed/Division Champions in the following seven categories of the Junior Livestock Show:

- Junior Steer Show
- Junior Swine Show
- Junior Lamb Show
- Junior Goat Show
- Regional Jr. Beef Heifer Show – American
- Regional Jr. Beef Heifer Show – English
- Regional Jr. Beef Heifer Show – Continental

The fund also establishes \$1,500 scholarships for Grand Champions and \$1,000 scholarships for Reserve Grand Champions in the following two categories of the Junior Livestock Show:

- Junior Dairy Show
- Junior Breeding Sheep Show (Ram & Ewe)

Scholarships are limited to one per animal per year. An exhibitor may win multiple scholarships with different animals or in different years. Scholarships are cumulative for all years of participation. See example below:

The entry deadline for this year's Livestock Show is Friday, September 17, 2010.

Late entries will be taken until Friday, September 24th. An additional \$10 late entry fee per animal per show will apply after September 17th.

GATE PASSES

Admission gates will open at 8:00 a.m. every morning and close at midnight each night. The policy for gate passes for the 2010 Heart O' Texas Fair & Rodeo's Livestock Show is as follows:

- Each participant will receive one armband good for fairground admittance all 9 days of the fair.
- Additional passes may be ordered for \$10 each which will be good for three days each.
- Season passes may be ordered for \$35 each and includes a free parking pass. Both are good for fairground admittance all 9 days of the fair.
- Parking passes may be purchased for \$10 each, good for all 9 days of the fair.
- You may order as many extra passes as needed, however, additional passes must be ordered with livestock entries.

VEHICLE PASS

Each Agriculture Science Teacher or County Extension Agent, who accompanies exhibitors, will receive one complimentary parking pass and season pass. Parking passes will be sold for \$10 for all exhibitors and parents' vehicles that will be parked in the exhibitor's designated parking area. These passes are offered on the online entry forms. All vehicles without a parking pass will be charged \$5 per day to park.

2010 HEART O' TEXAS FAIR & RODEO LIVESTOCK SHOW GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

The Heart O' Texas Fair & Rodeo, its officials, directors, employees and agents from hereinafter referred to as **Show Management**.

Statement of Liability:

All exhibits are under the control and direction of the Show Management, but the Heart O' Texas Fair Livestock Show is not responsible to any loss or damage that may occur even as a result of our own negligence. The exhibitor will be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him/her and for its description as given in the catalog. He or she shall indemnify the Heart O' Texas Fair Livestock Show against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto, as well as any damage or injury to any other person or property, caused by the exhibitor or any of the animals exhibited with such exhibition or any of the animals exhibited, even if caused by the negligence of the Heart O' Texas Fair Livestock Show. Exhibitor and each signatory hereto, and any servant, agent, family member or employee of the Exhibitor hereby waives all right to sue the Heart O' Texas Fair Livestock Show, even as a result of the Stock Show's negligence.

Rules:

All Livestock Rules & Regulations apply to all shows. There are additional rules on the specific show pages. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know and understand each and all of the rules applicable to them and their exhibits.

1. Interpretation and Violation of Rules

The Heart O' Texas Fair & Rodeo reserves, to its Executive Committee, the final and absolute right to interpret these general rules and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard hereto, or otherwise arising out of the right to amend or add to these rules as its judgment may determine. **The Heart O' Texas Fair Livestock Show also reserves the right to change the show schedule, delete classes or add breeds/classes at the discretion of the show officials.** An exhibitor who violates any of the rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the Executive Committee may order.

2. Eligibility of Exhibitors

To be eligible in the Junior Livestock Show, exhibitors must be Texas residents and a member of a Texas 4-H Club or FFA Chapter. Exhibitors must have continuously owned and personally fed and cared for their animals under the direct supervision of a CEA or AST. Exhibitors must be between the ages of 9 and 19 on or before August 31, 2010, and must be enrolled and attending public, private or home school. All animals entered for competition in the market classes: goats, steers, swine and lamb divisions – must have been owned by the exhibitor not less than the period specified for each division. Registry certificates of ownership or transfer for all registered breeding animals must be produced, showing the exhibitor to be the owner. The transfer will indicate period of ownership. **Exhibitors must furnish, if asked, animals for the junior livestock judging contest.**

3. Scholastic Eligibility:

All 4-H and FFA members are considered to be eligible by the Heart O' Texas Fair Livestock Show for participation in the Junior Livestock Show at the time entry applications are received from the AST/CEA. If an exhibitor is ineligible, then the entry is ineligible. The Heart O' Texas Fair Livestock Show has a NO PASS- NO PLAY rule. Exhibitors must meet scholastic and academic requirements and it is the responsibility of all CEA/AST's to ensure the eligibility of each exhibitor.

4. Substitute Exhibitors:

All entries in the Junior Show must be exhibited by the owner. Exception: substitute exhibitor will be allowed to show in place of the owner under the following circumstances:

- a. When an exhibitor has more than one entry in one class or another entry in the Junior Show and cannot be present. Exhibitor must notify show superintendent before animal enters show arena.
- b. No other substitutes will be allowed.**

The substitute must be an eligible junior exhibitor. Parents, teachers, extension agents or other adults will not be allowed to show. Substitutions are not allowed for academic ineligibility or any other school activity.

5. Disqualification:

In the event an exhibitor engages in any conduct which results in disqualification, the Heart O' Texas Fair Livestock Show, may, in its sole discretion, prohibit future participation by the exhibitor in any event which is sponsors.

6. Application for Entry:

All entries in the Junior Livestock Show must be made by the CEA or AST under whose supervision the animals were fed. The CEA or AST must certify on the entry form that the animal and the owner(s) are eligible under the rules of this show. It is the responsibility of the CEA or AST to read all rules and check each entry form carefully before signing it. If entries are not correctly submitted they will be returned. Entries must be submitted online by the CEA or AST at www.fairmanager.com. Once online entries are completed and submitted it is important to print off a summary sheet. CEA's and AST's must submit an Exhibitor Summary Form or Individual Entry Receipt with original signatures from the exhibitor, the exhibitor's parent and/or guardian, and the CEA or AST overseeing the project. The Exhibitor Summary Form can be found on our website at www.hotfair.com. The individual Entry Receipt may be printed out upon completing the online process along with the CEA/AST Group Summary Sheet at www.fairmanager.com. **A Medical Release Form for each exhibitor must also be included with entry packet to the fair office which can also be found on our website or online at www.fairmanager.com.**

All entries submitted must have original signatures-photocopied or faxed signatures will NOT be accepted. Copying the entries before submitting them for personal records will be allowed.

All entries must be made together and paid by one check payable to the Heart O' Texas Fair & Rodeo, and sent in by the county agent or vocational agriculture teacher with the entry forms. Entries submitted by individual club members will not be accepted. Payment must be in the form of a school check, 4-H club check or money order. Personal checks will not be accepted for any entries.

7. Refunds: *No Refunds – no exceptions.*

8. Bedding: Bedding is included with stalls. No outside shavings will be allowed.

9. Weighing:

Barrow, lamb and goat exhibitors will turn in their official show weight. The management reserves the right to weigh-back any animal at any time. Steers must be weighed and classified as scheduled.

10. Health Papers: Health papers are not required.

11. Livestock Trailer Parking:

No livestock trailers will be allowed to park inside the fairgrounds. Trailers must park in designated area.

12. Pets: No dogs will be allowed on the fairgrounds.

13. Fans: *Only rear fans are permitted if mounted on display. No on-ground fans allowed.*

14. Trim Chutes

No trim chutes or lamb tables (breeding sheep are allowed trim tables) are allowed on the Fair Complex.

15. Generators: Not allowed on Fair Complex.

16. Showmanship Ages: Junior – ages 8-13 Senior – ages 14-18

17. Special Rules:

Special rules or conditions are published in each department when necessary, and if there is a conflict between the special rules of any department and the general rules, the special rules will govern.

18. Disqualification:

No exhibitor shall be eligible to compete, or having competed, be eligible to win a premium, if he/she has been disqualified from competition in a show belonging to the North American Livestock Show & Rodeo Manager's Association, or has had a premium withheld or withdrawn on the grounds of rule violation involving misrepresentation, fraud of deception, practice or attempted.

19. ALCOHOL/DRUGS:

USE OR POSSESSION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR DRUGS (except for medical purposes) BY ANY EXHIBITOR ON THE FAIR COMPLEX WILL RESULT IN IMMEDIATE EXPULSION FROM THE COMPLEX & THE DISQUALIFICATION OF THAT EXHIBITOR'S ENTRY/ENTRIES.

20. Eligibility of Animals:

All animals in the breeding classes must be recorded or accepted for record in the recognized books of record for their respective breeds. Exhibitors must produce certificates of registry at the request of the Superintendent in charge any time during the Heart O' Texas Fair Livestock Show. No photocopies of registration papers are acceptable except in the case of scramble animals. The exhibitor must give, on our application of entry, the breed, date of birth, registration number and name under which animal is registered in the record association; otherwise, entry will not be accepted. This does not apply to animals entered in market classes, i.e., steers, lambs and pigs. Any market animal that has been offered for auction is ineligible to show.

21. Animal Substitution:

Substitutions will be allowed within the same breed and division as the original entry at the time of check-in. Substitutions will not be allowed once check-in is completed. Any animal substituted must meet any and all requirements for the show it is to be entered. There is no fee for substitution.

22. Show Ring Competition:

Entry Numbers: Each entry will be assigned a back number. In some divisions exhibitors will receive corresponding cards with numbers which must be displayed by exhibitors during judging.

Arena Promptness: Judging will not be delayed for animals entering the arena late. An exhibit not presented promptly at the scheduled time is barred from competition in the class.

Judging Contests: If and when an exhibitor is called upon to furnish one or more animals for the students judging contest, he or she will cooperate with the Show. Refusing to allow an animal to be used in this manner, without Show approval, could result in the forfeit of any prizes or such other action as the Show deems necessary. Selection of animals will be made under the direction of the department superintendent.

Disqualification: if an animal is disqualified after having won awards or premiums, the animals placing below may be moved up to fill the vacated position.

23. Ownership and Feeding Instructions:

The exhibitors must own their animals at the beginning of and throughout the feeding period, and must feed, care for and exhibit animals entered. The feeding and fitting period shall begin no later than June 30, 2010 unless exempted by special rules. Exhibitors will not be permitted to purchase fitted animals and then show them in any division. **BREEDING HEIFERS MUST HAVE ORIGINAL REGISTRATION PAPERS ONLY. NO EXCEPTIONS!**

24. Diseased Animals Barred:

Special care will be taken that no animal having a disease of any character will be admitted into the complex at any time, and the Superintendent of Livestock is instructed and authorized to refuse unloading privileges to any stock having a disease or undesirable ailment.

25. Objectionable Exhibits:

The management reserves the right to remove from the complex any exhibit, animal, or show that may be falsely entered, or may be deemed unsuitable, or objectionable, without assigning a reason. All fees will be forfeited.

26. Official Protests:

All protests must be made in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$100 CASH, which will be refunded if the protest is sustained. Such protests and fees must be submitted to the Livestock Manager. Protests must clearly state the cause of complaint or appeal, giving good and sufficient reasons therefore, and must be delivered to the Livestock Office immediately upon the occasion for such protest. Protests must officially be filed before the conclusion of the species show. These cases are referred to the Vice President of the Livestock Department, Livestock Committee Chairman & General Superintendent, who will have full power to act. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation.

27. Exhibitor Number:

Each entry will be assigned a number in the Official Records of the Show. Exhibitors will receive cards, which correspond with the numbers; these must be displayed by exhibitor when animals are being judged.

28. Erroneous Entry:

Exhibits that have been erroneously entered may be transferred to their proper class, prior to judging, upon application to the Superintendent who will determine the matter upon its merits. If such classes have been judged, however, they shall not be reopened.

29. Arrival Time: All animals must be in place according to schedule in each division.

30. Release of Livestock:

No animals on exhibition may be removed from the grounds before the date and time specified in this catalog. Release papers will be handed out by Show Superintendent.

31. Care of Animals:

All owners of property, or livestock, or others having same in charge, shall care for, guard, protect and preserve same as the Heart O' Texas Fair & Rodeo does not undertake to do so, and it shall not be responsible for any loss or damage to said property or the owners thereof.

32. Signs:

In show barns, livestock exhibitors are permitted to display a sign over each exhibit advertising their own herds. All other forms of signs or advertising must be approved by the management, and it reserves the right to have objectionable signs removed. No sign which reflects in any way to any commercial product may be placed over any champion, or any livestock exhibit.

33. Partnership:

Showing animals under a partnership is acceptable in the breeding sheep only; provided that all members of the partnership are eligible to show under Rule 20 AND IN THE SAME FAMILY.

34. Coloring:

No animal entered in any livestock division may show evidence of artificial coloring, paint, powder, glues, or adhesives. The only acceptable coloring shall be hoof dressing to be used on hooves only. All Livestock will be checked for body coloring only.

35. Campers/Trailers: No RV trailer parking allowed on fairgrounds.

36. Cooking:

Cooking is NOT allowed on the grounds at any time. No cookers, crock-pots, microwaves, coffee pots, warmers, or any other cooking utensils are permitted in the barn or on the grounds. Any cooking utensils, including coffee pots, brought onto the grounds will become the property of the Heart O' Texas Fair & Rodeo.

37. Exhibitor Safety:

If exhibition of an animal poses a danger to the exhibitor and/or other parties, Management reserves the right to allow a substitute exhibitor or remove the animal from competition.

38. Stall and Pen Space. All pens and tie spaces will be assigned prior to arrival on grounds.

39. ALL EXHIBITORS MUST SHOW THEIR OWN ANIMALS IN THE SHOWMANSHIP SHOWS.

JUDGES' RULES

40. Selecting of Judges:

Judges will be selected by the Heart O' Texas Fair & Rodeo and in every case the judge is selected with utmost care, and the highest qualifications.

41. Decision of Judges Final:

The decisions of the judges will be final in all cases, except where mistake, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, is proven. In such cases the management or such referee as he may appoint, may make decision, or the case may be referred to the Executive Committee, from whose decision there can be no appeal.

42. Interference with Judges:

If any exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by agent or servants, interferes with the judges during their adjudication, or shows any disrespect to them or the Show, the management may demand a proper apology from such exhibitor, or it may exclude him or her from the ring, and may also withhold exhibitor premiums, and may bar exhibitor from future participation in the Heart O' Texas Fair & Rodeo.

43. Time of Judging:

The Livestock Judging Program as published in the Livestock Premium Catalog will be followed as closely as possible. Exhibitors should ascertain at what time the exhibits will be judged. Any exhibit not presented promptly on scheduled time will be ruled out and barred from competition in the class called. No complaint or protest on the ground that judges overlooked exhibits will be considered.

44. Unworthy Exhibits:

Judges must not award a prize to an unworthy exhibit. It is the intention of the management that no premium or distinction of any kind shall be given any animal or article that is not deserving. Judges are also requested to discriminate against animals upon which a surgical operation has been performed to improve their “show” appearance. These rules must be strictly adhered to, whether there is competition or not.

45. Animals Disqualified:

Should any animal awarded a prize be disqualified, the animals gaining the lower prizes shall graduate up to the higher position next in order above them if, in the opinion of the judges, the animals are worthy of such prizes.

46. Unethically Fitted Livestock:

The showing of unethically fitted livestock, the showing of livestock of any ineligible age for exhibition in the class entered, or the misrepresentation of breeding or milking status is prohibited. Unethical fitting will be deemed to consist of changing the normal conformation of any part of the animal’s body or using drugs, including over the counter and/or extra-label, or mechanical devices to alter the physical makeup and/or performance of the animal. This includes but is not limited to the following:

- (a) Animals that are in milk due to an unnaturally induced lactation.
- (b) Balancing the udder by any means other than leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters.
- (c) Treating or massaging any part of the animal’s body, internally or externally, with an irritant, counterirritant, or other substance to temporarily improve conformation.
- (d) Minimizing the effects of cramping by feeding or injecting drugs and depressants or applying packs or using any artificial contrivance or therapeutic treatment except normal exercise.
- (e) Blocking the nerves to prevent limping or switching of the tail.
- (f) Striking the animal to cause swelling in a depressed area.
- (g) Surgery or other practices performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal’s body, hide, hoof or hair, except the removal of warts or horns and the permitted clipping and dressing of hair and trimming of hooves.
- (h) Insertion of foreign material under the skin.
- (i) Changing the color of hair at any point, spot or area on the animal’s body. Any grooming material that allows color to come off from any animal will not be allowed at the show.
- (j) The act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method per os (by esophagus) is prohibited.
- (k) The use of alcoholic or carbonated beverages in the feed or administered as a drench.
- (l) The use of diuretics.
- (m) Administration of a drug internally or externally. Animals under the care of a licensed veterinarian and/or taking any type of medication are ineligible.

47. IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS) NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS:

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics", fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethic demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificate from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates in the animals entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from, the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed vet.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animals performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except the external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of a penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

48. 2010 HEART O' TEXAS FAIR & RODEO ANIMAL CARE STATEMENT:

The Heart O' Texas Fair & Rodeo has developed an Animal Care Committee with representatives from across the state of Texas. The committee is charged with determining proper care is given to all species of livestock while they are on the Heart O' Texas Fair grounds as well as upholding high standards of animal husbandry and ethical practices of exhibiting animals.

**Summary of Texas Requirements
For Entry of Livestock (Domestic and Exotic), Poultry and Ratites into the State
and into Shows, Fairs, Exhibitions, and Assemblies**

Note: The following summary is a condensed version of the Texas Animal Health Commission regulations. The regulations will supersede this summary if there is a dispute between the two.

1. **Infected, Exposed or Quarantined for Disease**

Any livestock, poultry or ratites that are infected, exposed or quarantined in any manner for an infectious, contagious or communicable disease may not enter the state unless:

- A. They are consigned direct to slaughter or to an approved feed yard/pen *or* directly from the premise of origin to a specifically approved market for sale to slaughter or an approved feed yard/pen accompanied by a VS 1-27 permit (Swine that are infected or exposed to PRV may be moved from out of state only directly to a slaughter plant in Texas.); or,
- B. If quarantined as a result of Commission action may enter only as specified in the quarantine order established by the Commission; or,
- C. Given written permission by the Executive Director of the Commission for each movement.

NOTE: "Brushy-tailed possums cannot be transported into the State."

2. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection**

The certificate must indicate that the accredited veterinarian found the animals or fowl to be free of symptoms or evidence of communicable disease and that all tests, immunizations or treatments, required by the Commission, were completed. For certain diseases, a specific statement may be required indicating disease free status. The certificate is required to accompany animals and fowl entering the State of Texas as stated in the following summary of entry requirements. The certificate is valid for 45 days for equine and 30 days for all other species.

3. **Waybill**

The waybill may be used in lieu of a certificate of veterinary inspection to accompany:

- A. Cattle, 18 months of age and over, delivered directly from a farm of origin consigned to slaughter.
- B. Beef breed cattle, 18 months of age and over, entering from other than a farm-of-origin may be moved to slaughter, or to an approved feed yard/pen when accompanied by a Form VS 1-27 on which each animal is individually identified. Brucellosis test data shall be written on the VS 1-27 form which must include the test date and results (when required).
- C. Beef breed cattle, 18 months of age and over, delivered directly to a USDA specifically approved livestock market by the owner or consigned there and accompanied by a waybill.
- D. Beef breed steers, spayed heifers and beef cattle under 18 months of age, consigned to slaughter or a livestock market.
- E. Beef breed steers, spayed heifers and beef cattle under 18 months of age delivered to an approved feed yard for feeding for slaughter by the owner or consigned there and accompanied by a waybill.
- F. Swine consigned to slaughter.
- G. Poultry consigned to a slaughter establishment that maintains federal postmortem inspection.

The waybill must contain the name and address of the owner or shipper; point of origin; number and type of livestock and/or poultry; purpose of movement; official identification (when required); and destination.

4. **Prior Entry Permit**

Entry permits are required as noted in the following summary of entry requirements. Permits may be obtained by calling 512/719-0777 (24 hours) or 1/800-550-8242, or by writing the Texas Animal Health Commission, 2105 Kramer Lane, P. O. Box 12966, Austin, Texas 78711-2966.

5. **Entering Shows, Fairs, Exhibitions, and Assemblies**

- A. Livestock, poultry and ratites entering from out of state must meet this state's entry requirements. Texas origin dairy cattle are not required to test for tuberculosis to participate in a show, fair or exhibition within the state but they must be individually identified.
- B. Animals moving from out of state and entering for exhibition and sale must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection and a permit for entry when required by the entry regulations. The permit for entry is not required when livestock enter for exhibition and return to the state of origin. A permit is required for bulls: See #6. Cattle Entering the State from Other States; C. Trichomoniasis Requirements; (2).

- C. Poultry entered in terminal public exhibition events shall be accompanied by a certificate of source which identifies the flock of origin. Poultry entering in a non-terminal public exhibition shall be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection. The certificate of veterinary inspection shall state that poultry have been inspected and are free from evidence of infectious or contagious diseases; that the poultry have been vaccinated only with approved vaccines, and poultry have not originated from an area that has had an active avian disease within 30 days of entry. Poultry entering the state for public exhibition, from other states, must have either a negative flock or individual bird test for Avian Influenza, within 30 days of entry and the results of such test shall be recorded on the certificate of veterinary inspection. A negative pullorum-typhoid test is required within 30 days prior to entry or poultry must originate from flocks that meet either the Texas Pullorum-Typhoid Program and/or the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP).
- D. Equine may enter Texas for shows, fairs, exhibitions, or assembly purposes when accompanied by a valid equine interstate passport or equine identification card and a completed VS Form 10-11 showing negative results to an official EIA test within the previous 6 months or a certificate of veterinary inspection and a completed VS Form 10-11 showing negative results to an official EIA test with the previous 12 months.
- E. Equine originating in Texas and:
- (1) Entering pari-mutuel racetracks - Must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection and a negative test for EIA conducted within 12 months. Foals, under 8 months of age, nursing a negative dam are exempt from testing.
 - (2) Entering a show, fair, exhibition, and assembly - Must have a negative test for EIA conducted within the previous 12 months. Foals, under 8 months of age, nursing a negative dam are exempt from testing.
- F. All other livestock, poultry and ratites originating in Texas and:
- (1) Entering interstate shows, fairs, and exhibitions (those functions that permit livestock and poultry from other states to enter for show or exhibition and held in common facilities with Texas origin livestock and poultry of the same species) - Are exempt from an entry permit, except poultry, but must meet the same other requirements as for those entering from out-of-state and be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection.
 - a. Ratites must be individually identified with either an RFID device, a permanently attached tag or an implanted electronic device (microchip) and tested negative for Avian Influenza and Salmonella pullorum-typhoid within 30 days of entry.
 - b. Swine entered in terminal shows are exempt from brucellosis, leptospirosis and pseudorabies requirements.
 - c. Breeding rams originating in Texas are exempt from the brucella ovis test.
 - d. Vaccination for brucellosis is not required for cattle.
 - e. Texas origin dairy cattle are not required to test for tuberculosis to participate in a show, fair or exhibition within the state but must be individually identified.
 - (2) Entering all intrastate shows, fairs, and exhibitions (those functions that require Texas livestock, poultry and ratites of the same species to be housed and exhibited separate and apart from livestock, poultry and ratites from out of state) - Are exempt from the certificate of veterinary inspection and testing requirements, except;
 - a. poultry must originate from flocks or hatcheries free of pullorum disease and fowl typhoid or have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 30 days before exhibition.
 - b. all exhibition sheep and goats must have a scrapie identification ear tag except registered goats with a registration tattoo and accompanied by registration papers listing the scrapie premise ID number.
- G. Rodeo stock from Mexico shall be tested for tuberculosis by an accredited US veterinarian within 12 months prior to their utilization as rodeo or roping stock, and retested for tuberculosis every 12 months thereafter. This is in addition to the entry requirements set out in the section "Cattle Entering the State from Foreign Countries".

GATE PASSES

Passes (Wristbands): All junior show exhibitors will receive a wristband, good for the entire 9 days of the fair. All passes will be mailed to the CEA/AST that submitted entries several weeks before show begins. Open Show passes will be picked up upon arrival to fairgrounds from perspective shows superintendent.

Gate Passes: CEA's and AST's who are supervising projects will be issued one (1) free wristband and parking pass valid for the duration of the show. No additional passes (wristbands) will be complimentary but 3 day passes may be purchased in advance or from the Livestock Office for \$10 each.

Car Passes: Exhibitors and parents will be eligible to purchase Car Passes good for the duration of the show. Car passes must be fully affixed to the windshield of the vehicle. Partially applied, laminated, wrapped or taped stickers are not valid. Failure to comply will result in confiscation of Car Pass and loss of parking privileges. Car passes may be purchased (Valid for 9 days of Livestock Show) \$10.00 and must be purchased in advance.

Refunds: There are absolutely no refunds of entry fees or passes.

GOOD HOUSEKEEPING AWARDS

A banner will be given to the 4-H or FFA Club doing the best job of housekeeping in the Junior Livestock Show, Saturday, October 9th and Friday, October 15th. The Good Housekeeping Award will be judged periodically throughout the day. Exhibits should be ready to be judged from 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. They will be judged on the following: Neatness of exhibit and exhibitor; Helpfulness in barn; Attitude; & clean grooming area. A banner will be awarded on Sunday, October 10th and Saturday, October 16th to the Club or Chapter doing the best job all week.

CALF SCRAMBLE CONTEST RULES

1. **Age Eligibility.** Contestants must have reached their 12th birthday by September 1, 2010 and cannot be past their junior year in high school.
2. **Physical Requirements.** Contestants who report to the Scramble Office must be in top physical condition. Contestants appearing with broken limbs, etc. will be automatically disqualified. Contestant's minimum weight is 100 pounds.

No animals shall be changed from one class to another after entry closing date unless it is ineligible for the class in which it is entered. To be eligible for a group class, the animals must be shown in a single class.

6. Computing Ages:

While it is recognized that there is some variability in the age at which the different pairs of permanent incisor teeth first show, for the purpose of this Show (except in the case of breed association specials, when their rules will govern) the following rules will be:

a. All breeding lambs in order to be eligible to compete in their respective classes must be carrying all milk teeth at the time of entering the show ring. Lambs showing either or both of the first pair of permanent incisors will not be eligible to show in any of the lamb classes.

b. Sheep eligible to compete in the two-six tooth breeding classes may show the first and second pair of permanent incisors. Sheep which have dropped their central pair of milk teeth and show one or both teeth of the first permanent pair are eligible to show as singles only in the two-four tooth classes of their respective breeds.

c. Sheep with more than six permanent teeth may not exhibit in the show.

7. Ownership:

Papers on all registered animals must be shown to the Superintendent. Animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor and must have been owned by the exhibitor on or before June 30, 2009, as evidenced by date of transfer by the breed association. Name of the exhibitor must be on registration papers.

8. Partnership:

Partnerships are acceptable provided that all partners are eligible to show under Rule 3 – Special Rules - Junior Livestock Show.

9. Exhibitor's Flock: An Exhibitor's Flock in all breeds shall consist of one ram, any of the eligible ages, two-six tooth ewes, and two ewe lambs. The sheep making an Exhibitor's Flock must be shown in the single classes and must be owned by one exhibitor.

10. Trim chutes: allowed on fairgrounds for breeding sheep show only.

11. Club Lamb Division: Any unregistered or cross bred sheep is eligible to show in this breed. The purpose of this breed is to show the ram or ewe's ability to produce lambs suitable for club lamb shows. The animals will be shown in the same class breaks as all other breeds. 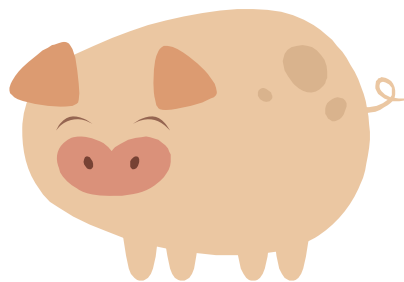

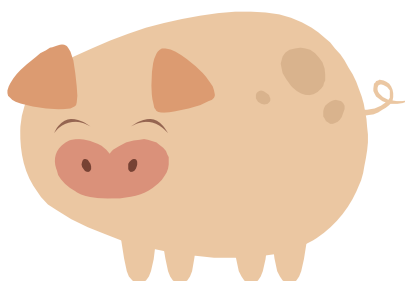

American Brahman Breeders Association Official Show Classes – 2009 Show Season

RULES

1. All entries and awards in this department will be subject to the General Rules.
2. Animals must be registered in the American Brahman Breeders Association to be eligible to compete in association sponsored shows. The registration certificate (or photocopy) for each entry must be available for presentation to the Superintendent or manger of the show at the time entries are verified prior to judging.
3. The registration number and animal identification number (number branded on animal) of (1) each animal must be entered in an individual class, (2) the sire of each get-of-sire entry and (3) the dam of each produce-of-dam entry must be listed on the entry card of each animal entered.
4. Entries that have not complied with rules one (1) and two (2) will not be eligible to show, receive premium monies or earn points in the association's Register of Renown.
5. Animals to be eligible to be shown in group classes must be entered and shown in individual classes.
6. Entries will be listed numerically according to age (oldest first) in catalogs and judging schedules. Include animal identification number (number brand) as a part of identification. When entering the arena for judging, the handlers will line cattle up numerically in the same order.
7. Judges will be allowed to comment on placing in selected classes when conditions permit.
8. Each animal will be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical or circulatory constrictions including banding or other appearance change, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Injections of foreign substances for cosmetic purposes shall be prohibited. If to the satisfaction of the ABBA's staff, officers, executive committee or board of directors any animal has had its natural conformation and structure altered; then said animal shall be ruled ineligible to compete until such time the executive committee and owner/owners have reviewed the case.
9. In cases where families, companies, corporations, etc. are operated as a unit under the same management, but have cattle also registered in the name of individual partners, said cattle, even though bearing a different ownership band, are eligible to be shown in competition under the firm name provided they have not been and will not be shown in the name of the individuals.

- 10.** For females being shown in the three oldest classes (females calved Sept. 1, 2008 – Aug. 31, 2008 for Fall Shows), exhibitor must have a certificate of pregnancy issued by a licensed veterinarian which will be presented to show officials at time of check-in or registration paper check. The show reserves the right to perform pregnancy determination by palpation for females in the above classes at any given ABBA approved show if any official protest has been filed. For fall shows the last class of females is required to have a calf at side also. The only exception to this rule will be cows that have already weaned a calf and a registration certificate of the calf **MUST** be presented to the judge.
- 11.** All bulls will be shown with a nose ring or nose restraint with lead attached. For bulls showing in the oldest class, the exhibitor must have a certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian stating the bull has produced viable semen. This certificate must be available for inspection by the judge on request.
- 12.** This deals with the produce of dam classes and the get-of-sire classes.
Embryo Produce of Dam – two animals from the above classes produced by one dam by embryo transfer either or both sexes may be presented. No ownership requirement.
Natural Produce of Dam – two natural born animals produced by one dam from the above classes, either or both sexes may be represented. No ownership required.
Get-of-sire – four animals from at least two dams by one sire from the above individual classes, both sexes represented. No ownership required.
- 13.** No exhibitor shall be permitted to show more than one produce or embryo-produce of dam entry per dam.
- 14.** Cows that are exhibited with calves at side must be in a lactating stage. Calves must be shown and exhibited with their dams and said calves must not exceed 240 days of age on day of judging. The ring steward will make the judge aware of those cows whose calves are ineligible to show by this rule.
- 15.** Cattle will not be allowed to show if their switches have been balled or glitter applied to their skin.
- 16.** The intent of the ABBA in shows that exhibit a large number of cattle is to have a separate red and grey show. If so, the following procedure will apply. All grey cattle and solid black cattle will show grey. Red, black and white speckled or red and white speckled cattle will show red. Cattle with questionable colored pigmentation may be entered in the color division the breeder selects, however, said cattle are subject to inspection by a 3 member ABBA committee. If the color committee disagrees with the breeder, the pedigree of said animal will then be used to aid in the final determination, by color pigmentation will take preference. In those cases where questionable colored cattle possess both red and grey breeding, then the committee will make the final determination. The decision of the committee is final. Once animals have been classified they will remain in that classification unless they were young at the time of classification and it is apparent that they have changed their color. In the get-of-sire and produce-of-dam classes, breeders will not be allowed to show cattle of varying color. They will be entered as to the color division they are assigned by the Color Committee for the show. At split shows where the color committee is not present, a staff member with (2) ABBA directors will clarify questionable colored cattle for that particular show. The final classification will be done by the color committee.
- 17.** The owner of record of any registered animal entered in an ABBA approved shows and/or his/her agent, exhibitor, fitter, handler and/or representative releases ABBA and its representatives from any and all liability that seller/owner might claim as a result of injury of any kind sustained before, during, or after handling cattle for any ABBA board approved activity.
- 18.** For shows to remain approved point shows by ABBA, they must maintain a 40 head average for the previous two years.
- 19.** The official ABBA rules and procedures governing showing and exhibiting of registered Brahman cattle supersede any rules printed in any show catalog.
- 20.** In an attempt to insure that all animals receive an equal evaluation at the National and International Shows, classes with more than 30 entries may at the discretion of the Show Management and/or ABBA Officials be split by age as evenly as possible.

The cattle will be judged in the following order:

- 1.** The Brahman Show will begin with the Red Brahman classes first. All calf classes will be judged through Reserve Calf and Calf Champion Red Brahman.
- 2.** Then the Grey Brahman classes will enter the ring and judge through Reserve Calf and Calf Champion Female.
- 3.** This procedure will be alternated between Red and Grey Brahman Shows until all age champions have been selected.
- 4.** After this, Calf Champion, Intermediate Champion, Junior Champion and Senior Champion Females of the Red and Grey Shows will be brought back to the ring at the same time. The judge will then select the Champion Red Brahman Female and Champion Grey Brahman
- 5.** The above procedure will be followed by bulls with the bull judging, beginning with the Red classes and alternating between Red and Grey shows.
- 6.** Group classes will be judged with Red Brahman Produce-of-Dam followed by Grey Brahman Produce-of-Dam and Grey Brahman Get-of-Sire followed by Red Brahman Get-of-Sire.

No exhibitor shall be permitted to show more than one produce or embryo-produce-of-dam per dam.
